During March, we also continue to move through the seasons of Lent. Lent is a time of preparation for Easter. During Lent, we reflect on Jesus, his life and teachings, and especially on the meaning of his death. We do this to fully understand and celebrate Jesus' resurrection on Easter Sunday. As a part of our Lenten journey this year, we will again have a Lenten Study Guide.

It will be a four-week guide written by Elder Joy Riley with a focus on prayer, fasting, and meditation leading up to our Stages of the Cross Event on March 21 at 6:30 pm. Stages of the Cross is an interactive prayer experience focused on the last hours of Jesus' life, led by Elder Joy Downing Riley. We encourage you to RSVP for this event.

During Lent, we'd also invite you to join us for our traditional Maundy Thursday Service on March 28 at 7 pm. With this service, we will take communion and trace the last hours of Jesus' life to his death. Orchard will again participate in the Community Good Friday Service held at the River Community Church at noon on March 29.

Finally, I invite you to join us on Easter

Sunday, March 31. Our services will be at as we prepare to celebrate his resurrection the regular time of 10:30 am. There will also be an egg hunt for children and some other fun activities following the service.

MESSAGE SERIES

Encounters with Jesus

Throughout the Gospels, people had amazing encounters with Jesus. These were ordinary people who were forever changed by their encounters with Him. With this series, as we walk through the season of Lent, we'll see how these people were changed by Jesus and recognize that through our own encounters with Jesus, He can change us, too. With this series, we will also refocus our hearts and minds on Jesus, on who He was, what Crowds of people on the road to He taught, and the meaning of His death,

on Easter Sunday.

March 3 - "A Girl and a Woman in a Mess" Mark 5:21-43 (Communion)

A girl and a woman had encounters with Jesus, and they found that He had the power to deal with even the biggest and messiest problems in their lives and that He didn't turn them away because of them. As we encounter Jesus, we find these same things are true of Him for us as well.

March 10 - "A Paralyzed Man" Mark 2:1-12

A Paralyzed man encountered Jesus, and he was healed and forgiven. As we encounter Jesus, He desires to heal and forgive as well.

March 17 - "A Reluctant Participant" John 5:1-15

A man who could not walk had an encounter with Jesus, and he took a leap of faith that changed his life. As we encounter Jesus. He also calls us to take leaps of faith.

March 24 - "The Adoring Crowds" Matthew 21:1-11 (Palm Sunday)

Jerusalem encountered Jesus, and they adored him because they believed He was the Messiah. As we encounter Jesus, who do we say that He is, and how could that change our lives?

March 28 - Maundy Thursday Service at 7 pm

March 31 - "He is Risen!: Two Disciples on the Road"

Luke 24:13-35 (Easter Sunday)

After Jesus was crucified, two of His disciples encountered an amazing man on the road to Emmaus, and their lives were



forever changed when they realized that Jesus had risen from the dead! As we encounter Jesus, may our lives be changed, too, as we realize that He is the Risen Lord!

I've been writing about four steps we can grow our faith:

- Personal daily devotional time listening to God, reading scripture, and praying.
- 2. Join others in studying and applying scripture. See opportunities above
- 3. **Discipleship**: Talk to others about your spiritual life and encourage each other to grow in faith and practice. (1 Thessalonians 5:11)
- 4. **Service**: Use your gifts and abilities to serve others, encouraging them in their faith journeys. (1 Thessalonians 5:11)

The third step is discipleship, which Lisa Johnson, ECO Executive Director of Leadership Formation, defined as "...a lifelong apprenticeship to Jesus and with others where we are learning to love and live like Him." It's encouraging each other to grow in Christ through sharing our personal spiritual experiences on a regular basis. Think about a specific person or few persons, with whom you could share a relationship based on authentically and honestly sharing one's struggles, doubts, sins, and progress over the next six months. If you are ready for this, text me at 805-766-6549 or write me at r_smith122@hotmail.com so I can help and encourage you.

Here are three possibilities to guide your meetings:

- 1. As you meet with your partner, or partners, you might consider the following questions from Bridge City Church in Cleveland, OH:
 - a. How has your time in the Scriptures refreshed you or challenged you?
 - b. What practices are helping you align your heart with God's heart?
 - c. Where is God making you aware of how you need to grow in conformity with Jesus?
 - d. How have relationships within the church helped you or others grow?

- e. How have your prayers, speech, and interactions with those who don't yet know Jesus pointed to the grace of God?
- f. How have your time, abilities, and finances been invested for God?
- g. How have your decisions reflected the priorities of God's mission?
- 2. Share about what God is doing with your heart, head, and hands. Your heart refers to your attitudes and character. Your head refers to how you think about God, his character, and his mission. This is transformation, not information (Rom 12:2), based on study and application of scripture. Your hands refer to how you show God's love in the places you live and work.
- 3. Use the following based on a previously agreed upon scripture read before meeting:
 - a. How is God growing me?
 - b. What did the scripture...
 - i. Say?
 - ii. Mean?
 - iii. Apply to me?
 - iv. What did you wrestle with?
 - c. What will I be doing this next week?
 - d. Pray for commitments from above and personal concerns.

- Discipleship Essentials Greg Ogden book, guide for 25 discipleship meetings.



A Prayer, Fasting and Meditation Guide


Sixteen hundred years ago Christians began calling the last days of Jesus' life on earth "Holy Week." Holy Week not only recounts the final week of Jesus' life but the days leading to Jesus' being crowned as King on Palm Sunday. Jesus was denied this same coronation by his people and killed on Friday by the Roman authorities as the "King of the Jews." When Jesus is raised from the dead by the Father's holy power after lying in his tomb for three days, Jesus is finally enthroned over all nations as the true King of the Universe, ruler over life and death. We celebrate Easter because Jesus is who He said He claimed to be.

The Worship Committee has created a prayer and meditation guide, "Encounters with Jesus 2.0" to help us prepare spiritually in advance for Holy Week through Scripture readings, prayer exercises, fasting and meditation.

The guide culminates with **Stages of the Cross** service on Thursday, March 21, 2024, from 6:30 - 7:30 pm in the Worship Building and we will walk through Holy

Week, seeking to see how Jesus experienced his last days to help us grow closer to understanding Jesus' love and sacrifice for us.

This is how we're experiencing your amazing gift of time and material goods:

Under the leadership of Randy Metz and

the assistance of Randy Ringen and many volunteers, we made 1000 **soup-in -a-bag** meals. These were distributed to One Stop, the Salvation Army shelter and pantry, and the Turning Point Foundation

shelter. Thank you, Randy!!

During January and February, we collected winter clothing, such as blankets, tarps,



gloves, beanies, jackets, sweaters, socks, etc. for the **Winter Warming Shelter** and One Stop. The number of great donations was wonderful, and all have been distributed and used by unhoused people.

GLOBAL MISSIONS



Many Christians observe the season of Lent by choosing to give something

up, whether it is a particular food or drink, a habit or some other behavior.

Once again, this year during Lent the Global Mission Team will provide the opportunity for Orchard to participate in Significant Sacrifice. Individuals, families and small groups can donate what they would have spent on something they have given up for Lent, to bring clean water, hygiene and the gospel to people in need.

Our goal this year is to be able to donate 3000 dollars for the Benza area in Ethiopia where we have contributed in the past.

At the beginning of this year, Lifewater International joined with Water for Good to form one organization committed to tackling water poverty, providing safe water and improving sanitation and hygiene while showing the love of Jesus. Sustainability will continue to be a focus in all of the countries they serve.

The new partnership will keep the name, Water for Good, as they have strong name recognition in the WASH (Water, Sanitation and Hygiene) sector. Another factor in the choice is the name Lifewater International is often confused with Lifewater bottled water.

Look for the large water bottle on the patio for your donations every Sunday throughout Lent. Information is also in the weekly email and bulletin. Our contributions can enable families to wake up in the morning to clean water.

Orchard gives to missions and each year the Global Mission Team prayerfully reviews their budget and designates the funds to our mission partners. This year we were able to add Nat and Wes as full partners. Their ministry is Agape Whole Hearted and serves on the Arabian Peninsula. Photos and information on their work are on their confidential website (see section "Natalie M."). These words from Nat express their gratitude for Orchard's support financially and in prayer; "This is incredible news and we are so, so encouraged by Orchard's pledge of

support. It is an answer to prayer and certainly loving provision from the Father!....We really consider each donation as a piece of our partnerships-the bigger pieces are the sincere relationships with all of our supporters and the spiritual "covering" they keep over us. If you'd like to zoom with us, and chat face to face we'd be all about that! We write this with fond affection and sincerest appreciation. Nat & Wes."

Along with monthly support to our partners, we continue to receive funds from the tithe of the Thrive Campaign, which enable us to make occasional special gifts to our partners.



Last month we received this news from the Bates family, our partner in Romania, "On Christmas morning we awoke to

discover that our wood stove, the source of our home's heat has sprung a leak. For two days, it was 45 degrees in our home. We temporarily have learned how to keep a fire safely going with the leak, which cannot be repaired, but it's very tentative and we know we need to replace it soon before the colder weather comes and our improvised solution falters. Since natural gas arrived on our road this fall, our next move is to central heating." Global Missions was able to make a gift to the Bates toward installing central heating.

Here are Brandi's words of gratitude, "Dearest Orchard Community! This is a shock! A surprise! A "are you kidding?" And ultimately, a "God, You are the most amazing!" We are truly blown away! We don't really know how to thank you other than to say THANK YOU! And how convincing of God's Love and Care for us and our family this is. WOW!!! We will keep you posted on how installing

central heating in our home goes...it won't be right away as things do not happen quickly here, and we are so grateful for now that our old stove is, for the time being, functioning with a lot of Poxipol holding back the leak that sprung Christmas Eve...until the next leak. :) We are so grateful for your more than generous gift towards more sustainable, reliable heat in our home (hot water too!). We also hope to see you this summer, and will keep you posted. With ALL of our thanks...we thank God for you!!!!!!!!!! Brandi and the Bates Family."

SESSION

Highlights - February Session Meeting

The Session of Orchard Community Church met on February 8, 2024 in the Library. Moderator Matt Hoyt called the meeting to order at 6:52 pm. Before the meeting was called to order, Session had shared prayer and a devotional on John 3:30, Galatians 2:20, and Romans 8:29, led by Matt. Voice and Vote privileges for this meeting were given to Jerry Horstmeyer, Elder-elect, because he was not able to be installed yet due to illness.

Pastor's Report

Pastor Matt shared several prayer concerns and needs in the congregation and how elders could be praying for them and/or reaching out to them. At the end of the meeting, Session spent time praying for them. Matt shared that the recent rains did not cause any further damage to the lower campus, thanks to some drain and gutter work, a sump pump and sandbags being in place.

Elder Barry Reagan brought the new job descriptions for the Office Coordinator and Digital Media Coordinator and they were approved with only a few minor changes. The Personnel Committee will begin the search for the new Digital Media Coordinator, and Alisa Bossoletti is the new Office Coordinator after Lisa Beamer's retirement.

Youth Director

David Pels came to Session to ask that the search for a new Youth Director be started, and not wait until after the Assistant Pastor/Director for Outreach and Discipleship is hired. David had compelling reasoning, and the Personnel Committee will look at the Youth Director Job description and bring it to the next meeting for further discussion. The PNC will also know better by then what the status of their search is.

Pastor Nominating/Search Committee

Elder Judy Alexandre gave an update from the PNC, and shared that they have received a couple more applications for the Assistant Pastor/Director of Discipleship and Outreach position, and are moving forward with one of them, as well as two that are farther along in the process. Applications closed January 16, and at their next meeting they will decide whether to continue or pause the process.

Preschool/Sunday School Flood

The Preschool/Sunday School flooding during the heavy rains in December was discussed. Session approved the payments of the repair work and the cleanup work. They also approved a bid from Apex Construction for mitigation work to prevent future flooding. The total will be over \$140,000, which will be covered by the excess General Fund giving in 2023 (about \$45,000), a contribution from the Preschool, excess funds donated to

Thrive at year-end, funds donated by the congregation specifically for this cause, and some reserves if needed. In addition, Dale Watson shared that Orchard's Insurance will pay \$25,000 towards the repairs, and those funds were already being transferred in.

ECO National Gathering

Elder Rich Smith and Matt Hoyt reported on the ECO National Gathering they attended in South Carolina in late January. The theme was Metanoia, which can mean to repent and change or also to adopt a different mindset, for example about how to reach a new generation for Christ. Both Rich and Matt were very positive about the teaching, worship, business meeting, etc., and Rich had sent a written report to Session. Matt shared that several short video teaching sessions will be published and Session will view them in the future.

Women's Retreat

A motion was approved to have the Women's Retreat speaker, Andrea Messinger, an ECO pastor, be the Communion celebrant at the retreat on Sunday, February 25.

Vision and Goals

The Vision and Goals work begun at the Session Retreat was continued. Before the next meeting, committees and teams are asked to go back and look at their goals and objectives, and try to make the objectives more specific and measurable, per information shared in the Session packet, and to be ready to discuss further at the next meeting.

Finance


January saw \$68,200 of giving income while \$61,500 was spent. This is an encouraging start as this is the first time in many years

Thank you for all you do for Orchard ministries and missions!




