

May 22 HE>all “A Greater Sacrifice: Part 2 (Once and for all)” Hebrews 10:1-18

**Gist:** We are made perfect by Jesus' greater, once and for all, sacrifice on the cross because it took away all our sins forever. Because of this we never run out of God's grace.

1. How does the opening line of Hebrews 10 (Heb 10:1) reflect the thoughts of the previous chapter?
2. Summarize the argument in Hebrews 10:1b-4.
3. Hebrews 10:9b says “He sets aside the first to establish the second.” What is the “first” and “second” referring to?
4. How is this thought related to Jeremiah 7:21-23?
5. Hebrews 10:10 says we have been “made holy”, an idea repeated in verse 14.. What does this mean? Look also at Jeremiah 31:33-34.
6. God doesn't remember our wickedness and sin, accepting instead the blood sacrifice of Christ and putting the Holy Spirit (God) inside us.
  - a. Why do we sometimes have difficulty completely forgiving either ourselves or others likewise?
  - b. How can we practice seeing ourselves and others as God does?
  - c. Describe what difference this might make in the world.
