A NOTE FROM MATT

As you may have noticed, we have begun upgrading the sound and lighting systems in the Worship Center. We are very excited about these upgrades as they will lead to a significantly better quality of sound and lighting and greater flexibility in what we can do. So far, all that is observable is that several new light fixtures have been installed in the ceiling. However, there is much more to come. There will be more light fixtures and a set of new speakers, among other things.

The most visible element of these upgrades will be a large number of fabric-covered panels that will be installed on the interior walls of the worship building.

These panels will dampen the echo in the room and make for sharper and clearer sound. The color of these panels will be similar to the color of the walls, so they should not stand out a great deal, but they will change the room's look to some degree.

As we come to April, I also wanted to highlight a key opportunity to serve. On April 13, Orchard will host a work day at two different locations in town. One will be a painting project at The City Center. The City Center is a faith-based transitional living center for homeless families with children. The other opportunity will be at The Arch Homeless Shelter, operated by Mercy House. Volunteers at this site will sort donations and do some other odd jobs. I encourage you to take advantage of these opportunities to serve and put your faith into action as we seek to make a difference in our community together.

NEW MESSAGE SERIES

Esther: God Behind the Scenes

Esther is the only book in the Bible that doesn't mention God. On the surface, God seems absent from this story. Sadly, that's a familiar idea for many of us. Sometimes, we may feel like God is absent from our lives and world. But the story of Esther reveals that God is always present behind the scenes, often working with great power, even when He may seem absent to us. Esther is the story of God's loving and sometimes hidden providence, the truth that He is over all things working out His will, and the amazing truth that he uses ordinary, flawed people to accomplish His plans. In the end, through a series of stunning reversals, we find that God is definitely not absent but is, in fact, the central character in this story and that He is always at work for the good of His people and for His glory.

April 14 "Where is God?"

Esther 1:1-22

It may seem to us at times that God is absent when, in fact, He is present behind the scenes. God used one person standing up for what was right, exposing the frailty of this worldly kingdom and creating the opportunity for his plan to unfold. God's power and providence mean we always have hope, not least of which is for a greater Kingdom.

April 21 "God Prepares the Way"

Esther 2:1-18

While Xerxes is enacting his plan, God's providence leads Esther to become Queen because of the role she will play in His plan. God is often at work in our lives in ways we can't see, and He can use us despite our situations, shortcomings, and sins.

April 28 "Buckle Up"

Esther 2:19-3:15

We live in a broken world where life is often hard and unfair, and we often sin and suffer, but God is always near and at work for the good of His people. So we always have hope, not least of which is for a greater King!

Good news! There are many small groups and 9 AM Sunday morning opportunities to help you to grow in your spiritual life. Sunday morning worship is essential, but it is not the only essential. If you have been feeling the least bit empty, as if there is something that you are missing out on, 2

that could be your prompting to try something new, like a small group or a Sunday 9 AM class. They're there, waiting for you. What used to be routine pre-Covid seems so much harder now, but it is still utterly doable. You can do it!

Speaking of doing it, I counted ten local mission partners Orchard is supporting on the Orchard website. Getting enough volunteers for church and mission activities is a persistent problem throughout the church that you can solve. Your Orchard Directory on pages 43-61 describes Orchard's various ministry team activities from last year, most of which are ongoing. Royal Family Kids Camp (RFKC) is

happening again this summer in the Ojai valley from July 1 - 5. Our mission is to provide a week of positive memories for children 7 to 11 years old that are in the Family Preservation, Foster Care, and adoption system. Some of these children have had a rough start to their lives through no fault of their own and need people to come alongside them to show they are wanted. The camp also provides respite for the care-taking family while the children are at camp. This is a Godcentered camp that seeks to show kids

the love and hope of Christ.

The funding for the camp is all raised through private donations. All the people who make this camp happen are volunteers, giving their time and energy to create this unique experience that has a deep impact not only on the campers but the people who serve. We want to serve about 40 children this year, which means we need many volunteers from the faith community.

We need volunteers from every stage of life ranging from 16-100 in both full-time and part-time positions. What are the ways you can help? You can apply to be a counselor or a support staff. Even if you can only help one or two days, during the mornings or evenings, you can make a difference. Can't go to camp? Then maybe you take some time to help with opportunities such as camper registration or welcome home dinner or writing notes of encouragement to the children. You can donate funds or items for backpacks and birthday boxes that are given to each kid. There are so many ways that you can make an impact on a child's life.

GLOBAL MISSIONS

Jesus enjoined his disciples, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to

me. Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Matthew 28: 18-20

As a church, our giving to missions (global and local) and our prayers for our partners are some ways we follow Jesus' command. The partner updates below give us examples to enlarge our vision about opportunities to "Go and teach" at home or abroad.



Once again, this year during Lent the Global Mission Team coordinated Significant Sacrifice, an opportunity for people to bring offerings of what we would have spent on something for ourselves, as a donation to Water for Good (formerly Lifewater International). Our gifts will bring clean water, hygiene, sanitation and the love of Jesus to people in Benza, Ethiopia. Pastor Matt and other members of Orchard visited Benza in the past to observe this project.

Our goal this year is to be able to donate \$3,000 dollars toward the Benza project, and we collected \$4,422.09!

In Benza nearly 1 in 5 people do not have a toilet, so they go outside in the open. This is a major public health crisis and potential safety concern, especially for women and children. Over 70 percent of the population is using an unsafe source of water. The good news: diarrheal

disease, a leading cause of death for children under five years old, can be decreased substantially with drinking safe water and practicing proper sanitation and hygiene. Below is one woman's story.

Workenesh lives in Bode Village with her husband and five children. She was never able to go to school and she works hard and provides for her family by preparing food for them, cleaning the house, washing their dishes, working on the farm, and fetching water from a spring. The spring is unprotected, meaning that it is highly contaminated by waste from livestock nearby and erosion from nearby land.

"We don't have clean water. We travel a lot of kilometers when the dry season comes starting from February to May because of the decrease of the spring," she said. The round trip to bring water back to her family when the spring is running takes an hour. The water, which is unsafe for drinking, often makes them sick. When Workenesh and her family are sick, they cannot farm, which causes them to lose money. Additionally, they must spend much of their hard-earned money on hospital visits. This cycle perpetuates poverty, but is hard to break without safe water.

The objectives in Bensa include equipping 5 primary schools across three districts – Gonjobe, Denbi, and Hache – and one primary school in Murago. Other projects planned are: Constructing a solar-powered spring serving nine villages, a gravity spring water system, establishing four water points at schools, constructing, seven new school latrine blocks, and supplying the area with a total of 23 wells

 17 new borehole wells, two shallow wells, and four hand-dug wells.

Dana will serve as Multi-Country Missionary in Youth Education & Ministry."

From OCMC: "Dana and his wife Brandi moved to an impoverished coal-mining region in Romania in 1999. They developed Romania's first adventure education and ropes course summer camp called Viata ("the Life" in Romanian), which has given around 700 youth a transformative summer camp experience every year and introduced them to the Orthodox Way of life. As a follow-up to the summer camp, Dana & Brandi developed a service-learning model called IMPACT that, besides teaching all sorts of life-skills, introduces youth to Orthodoxy by living the "liturgy (service to others) after the Liturgy." IMPACT has gone on to become a global best practice model and is used in over fifty countries through organizations like World Vision. Dana has worked closely with the Romanian Orthodox Church and plans to share these experiential learning models throughout the world through OCMC and its partners. Dana and his wife converted to Orthodoxy in 2004, and Dana went on to get his PhD at Oxford on Orthodox theology in dialogue with

development studies (causes of poverty and well-being). Dana and Brandi have two children, Briana Jelsa and Gabriel Matei. Their passions are hiking, mountain biking, and spending time outdoors."

Highlights of the March Session Meeting

The Session of Orchard Community Church met on March 14, 2024 in the Library. Moderator Matt Hoyt called the meeting to order at 7:12 pm. Before the meeting was called to order, Elders had shared dinner, fellowship, prayer and discussion with the Deacons at their annual joint meeting.

Joint Meeting with the Deacons

At the annual joint meeting of the Deacons and Elders. Pastor Matt shared a devotional and there was discussion about church leadership, based on Acts 20:28. Elders and Deacons shared some of the highlights and challenges of serving in their ministries, as well as things they wanted each other to know.

Pastor's Report

Pastor Matt shared several prayer concerns and needs in the congregation and how elders could be praying for them and/or reaching out to them. He requested and Session approved his vacation for the week after Easter, April 1-5. Melinda Hoyt will preach on April 7. Matt clarified that due to the VUSD summer schedule moving up, the Tent dates for this summer will be earlier. The tent will be up and Worship will be outside from June 30 (VBS Sunday) through August 4, with the Lemon Festival August 4 and fall kick-off Sunday, August 11.

Pastor Nominating/Search Committee

Elder Judy Alexandre gave an update from the PNC, and shared that they no longer have anyone in the interview process for the Assistant Pastor/Director of Discipleship and Outreach position, and will be pausing the process for a month. During that time, they will make a few


tweaks to the job description before reposting, and it should then rise back to the top of the list on job posting sites.

Session discussed whether the search for a new Youth Director should be started, and not wait until after the Assistant Pastor/Director for Outreach and Discipleship is hired. Based on the status of that search and the need for the Youth to have a new permanent director, the Personnel Committee was directed to create a job description and begin work towards starting the search. They will bring back proposed salary, hours, and possible search committee members, as well as the revised job description, to Session.

Spiritual Assessment Survey

Elders Rich Smith and Joy Downing Riley shared the results of the Spiritual Assessment survey done recently, and the implications of the results. They will be useful in knowing how to write Bible studies, prayer guides and devotionals, lead groups, give input to sermons, and in general help Session know how to disciple the congregation. There are implications for almost all ministries so it was recommended that all teams review the results.



Presbytery Meeting at Orchard

Matt discussed the Presbytery meeting that will be at Orchard Saturday, May 11th. Judy Alexandre has volunteered to lead recruiting for the help needed. Lunch will be paid for by the Presbytery, but Orchard people will be needed to coordinate ordering, serving, set-up, RSVP's, etc., and serve as hosts for the day.
